

## 2020 ITS TEXAS PROJECT AWARD

The ITS Texas Annual Awards Program was created to recognize an individual or group (e.g., a city, agency or company) for a project or other contribution in the fields of ITS policy, planning, design, deployment, research or education.

The Awards Committee evaluated all the nominations and selected the winners. Awards were presented at the ITS Texas Virtual Annual Meeting during the Opening Session on Tuesday, November 10, 2020. Below is a summary of the project award. The individual award winner will be featured in an upcoming newsletter.

## **CAMPO Region Open Roads Policy**

The Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO) and the TxDOT Austin District were awarded an ITS Texas Award for implementing the first Open Roads Policy in Texas. Open Roads Policies have been put into place in states across the country as a means for State Departments of Transportation and State Law

Enforcement agencies to commit to safe and quick clearance of traffic incidents. This focus on opening roads quickly provides an increase in safety for first responders and the traveling public, and can significantly reduce congestion from traffic incidents.

In Texas, a statewide Open Roads Policy does not currently exist. Recognizing the importance of quick clearance, especially in light of major construction planned for IH-35 through the Austin Region, CAMPO and the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) Austin District have been developing strategies to reduce the

impact of traffic incidents. Strategies that the agencies have focused on include expanding the coverage of the TxDOT freeway management system, continued operation and expansion of the HERO freeway service patrol, and 24-hour operation of the TxDOT Traffic Management Center located at the Combined Transportation, Emergency and Communications Center (CTECC) in Travis County.

In order to elevate the importance of incident management in the region and encourage the continued support of incident management strategies in central Texas, CAMPO and the TxDOT Austin District developed an Open Roads Policy for

the CAMPO Region. The policy urges all transportation and first responders to work together for safe and quick clearance of traffic incidents and to do whatever is reasonable to reduce the risk to first responders on scene, reduce the risk of secondary traffic incidents, and reduce delays associated with incidents, maintenance, construction, and enforcement. The policy also adopts the National Unified Goal of clearing all traffic incidents from the travel portion of the roadway within 90 minutes.

The CAMPO Transportation Policy Board, which is made up of elected officials from central Texas and the TxDOT Austin District, approved the Open Roads Policy on November 2, 2020. While several metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs) in the U.S. have endorsed their statewide Open Roads Policy, the CAMPO Region Open Roads Policy is believed to be the first such policy developed and approved by an MPO.

ITS Texas recognized CAMPO and the TxDOT Austin District at our November 10, 2020 ITS Texas Virtual Annual Meeting for their forward thinking and proactive approach to incident management. 
